

We the students of California State Universities and California Community Colleges, in order to confront the issues affecting our schools and to combat the neoliberalization of education, have devised a set of demands.

These demands seek to address: our immediate needs as working-class students and prefigurative goals towards offensive action against the system of capitalism.

Through our organizing and demands, the *California Autonomous Student Movement* seeks to build a web of autonomous student communities and create student popular power.

**We students demand the following:**

1. We students demand a 50% increase in admissions to all CC & CSU schools within the next decade. CSU campuses are meant to be accessible. Between 2005 and 2015 enrollment has increased by 77% but CSU has cut back on freshman, transfer admissions, and is now getting back to pre-recession levels. Nearly 80,000 qualified students were turned away. We demand that CSU be open and consistent with its promise of being for all students.
2. We students demand preservation of all gender, ethnic, race, liberal studies, etc, as requirements. Funding to these electives (which provide an alternative way of seeing the society we live in) have been severely cut in the past few years. Administrations have sought to expand profits off of technical courses and mainstreaming.
3. We students resist mainstreaming of CSU & CC courses, and demand that at most, 25% of college courses be offered online.
4. We students demand all full time campus workers be given a liveable wage, and that part time workers be given a minimum \$21 hourly pay rate. We also demand that layoffs be completely prohibited following this implementation.
5. We students demand that all military and armed forces be removed from CSU & CC campuses. We demand recruiting be prohibited at CSU & CC schools, and all defense funding be cut from California universities.
6. We students demand that hate speech be prohibited on campus and that hate groups like Identity Europa, Young Americans for Freedom, Turning Point USA, and so on, be prohibited from recruiting, tabling, and holding speeches. These groups seek to expand a vision of society where the majority of California students are denied existence, so we demand that their platforming and hate speech be prohibited. We demand that administration stops legitimizing their fascist agenda and that schools cut funding from all far right groups.
7. We students demand the ousting of corporate funding and sponsorship, particularly those related to fast food chains and restaurants. We demand the creation of autonomous spaces for ecologically conscious alternatives to neoliberal consumption.
8. We students demand all food be free and accessible on campus and demand the creation of student run food pantries, gardens, and farms.
9. We students demand that in order to sustain the collective spaces addressed in demand six, we also demand that universities offer free courses in order to gain the skills and means to develop sustainable food production. We also demand campuses allocate plots/spaces for student food autonomy.
10. We students demand that Los Angeles's status as a sanctuary city be taken to practice, and demand the ban of all Immigration Customs Enforcement officers from entering CSU & CC campuses.
11. We students demand all California CSU & CC schools be made sanctuary schools.

12. We students demand that law enforcement be forbidden from entering CSU & CC campuses.
13. We students demand free emergency housing and free housing at CSU and CC campuses for students in need.
14. We students demand the immediate ceasefire of the 2019 tuition hike, and all future tuition hikes at CSUs and CCs.
15. We students demand the expansion of campus health services. We also demand immediate access to campus health services, and a free universal healthcare program for all students at CSU and CC campuses. We demand that this free access to healthcare be actualized without an increase of tuition or taxation on students and their families.
16. We students demand that accessibility accommodations (closed captioning on videos, chairs appropriately spaced apart in classrooms, scent-free facilities, laptops and other assistance devices to be used as needed) should not have to be "requested," but be assumed and provided in all courses, facilities, events, etc.
17. We students demand the firing of all current Board of Trustee members at CSU & CC schools. We also demand that these positions not be replaced with new candidates.

Schools should be run by those who learn and teach. The Board of Trustees continue to reap massive pay increases while universities suffer from a lack of social programs, and adequate pay for faculty and campus workers.

18. We students demand the removal of SAT and ACT admission requirements and school application fees for all CSU and CC campuses.
19. We students demand that curriculum drafting include the student body, and for students to gain more control of the education being offered at universities.
20. We students demand that CSU and CC schools offer free TAP/metro cards for all students who request them without additional tuition fees, penalties, or hikes inflicted upon students and their families.
21. We students demand all student textbooks and books be free for all students.
22. We students demand non judgemental and non-sexist access to reproductive care and abortion on campus to women.
23. We students demand queer and trans student inclusive policies and the protection of transgender students' right to use restrooms that match their gender identities. We demand the expansion of health resources for transgender students, particularly better access to hormone replacement therapy at CSU and CC campuses.
24. We students demand the abolition of the tuition based system.
25. We students demand that all higher education in California state and community schools be free as promised in the *California Master Plan* (the program that actualized free education for all California residents in 1960).
26. We students demand the abolition of all higher university student debt on a national level.

27. demand the socialization of education from K-12 to the university level.
